

SWJACOR10: Correspondence Record on CP1448 and Earned Settlement

Redaction-safe archive bundle summarising SWJA communications, government responses and procedural correspondence concerning CP1448 and the Earned Settlement proposal.

Scope

This archive bundle summarises correspondence and procedural records concerning SWJA engagement with government and parliamentary channels during and after the CP1448 Earned Settlement consultation. It is not a reproduction of private correspondence in full.

Personal data, private contact information and non-essential mailbox details have been excluded. The purpose is to preserve a verifiable procedural record for policy analysis, institutional review and public understanding.

Timeline

5 January 2026	Email sent to Darren Jones MP / Minister for the Cabinet Office.	Later transferred to Home Office / HRFU channels.	Shows cross-government routing of the issue.
12 February 2026	SWJA submitted consultation evidence and attachments to Home Office consultation, Migration Policy and Public Enquiries channels.	Automated acknowledgement and mailbox notices were received from several official channels.	Records formal consultation submission activity before the deadline.
19 February 2026	No further SWJA action recorded in this bundle.	Ministerial response from Mike Tapp MP states that consultation responses were under review and that the final model would consider exemptions and transitional measures.	Confirms transitional measures remained under consideration.
27 February 2026	SWJA transmitted consolidated written submission and evidence bundle to Home Office, Direct Communications Unit and Treasury Solicitor channels for the administrative record.	Automated mailbox notices were received.	Records submission of consolidated material after earlier evidence formation.
25 March 2026	No further SWJA action recorded in this bundle.	HRFU / Direct Communications Unit response acknowledges SWJA's compiled work but states that detailed answers could not be provided while analysis continued.	Shows acknowledgement without substantive policy commitment.

Key observations

- Government correspondence recognised transitional arrangements as directly relevant to people already in the system.
- SWJA materials were submitted through consultation, ministerial and departmental correspondence channels before and after the consultation deadline.
- Later responses acknowledged the compiled work but did not provide detailed answers while policy analysis continued.
- Automated mailbox notices show the practical limits of email-based public engagement channels once consultation routes closed or changed.
